Recovery Coach Academy

Recovery Coaches successfully connect people to long-term and sustained recovery. As such, the Recovery Coach role continues to gain momentum throughout the country. Emergency Departments can greatly benefit from these services. With a growing population of people coming through their doors for help related to substance use, Emergency Departments are seeking specially trained individuals who can easily adapt to this fast-paced environment with a common goal - connecting people to recovery. The observations and knowledge accumulated by CCAR, the providers of the CT ED Recovery Coach program, have been outlined in this two-day program designed to prepare those Recovery Coaches who have a desire to serve in this rewarding role.

PARTICIPANTS IN THIS COURSE WILL:

- Describe the roles and functions of the Recovery Coach working in the Emergency Department
- Understand and practice staying in their lane
- Develop skills to advocate and educate staff, patients, etc. as a way to demonstrate accountability within the role
- Use the Motivational Interviewing (MI) to bring people through the stages of change into Recovery
- Further develop their own art of Recovery Coaching
